Job Shadowing Program

Taunton Area School to Career's Job Shadowing Program provides students with the opportunity to shadow someone at their place of employment in order to:

- Experience what it is like to spend a day at the work site
- Be exposed to the culture of the workplace
- Link the work experience with their academic/vocational classes
- Learn more about their intended future career through informational interviewing



Job Shadowing Experience

Job Shadowing is an experience for students who are beginning to look at future endeavors. TASC coordinates this experience. These students need to be recommended by a guidance counselor or teacher, have a career in mind they would like to explore and have their own transportation. Students complete an evaluation form and work towards a possible internship.



Job Shadowing can give young people a new perspective on their studies because it shows them a number of choices for their future. According to an evaluation from the Kravis Institute at Claremont-McKenna College, students also become more academically motivated after experiencing Job Shadowing because they are better able to grasp the connection between school and careers. Job Shadowing introduces students to the requirements of professions and industries, building a more prepared workforce for the 21st century.
